

Medications & Behavior





Medications

- Per District policy, prescription and OTC medications must be handled by a *Mills staff member* prior to and during the trip
- Please place in a Ziploc bag with a 3x5 card with the following info (give to Mills staff member Friday morning):
 - Student's name
 - Name of medication
 - Condition it treats
 - Dosage information

Note: Inhalers and epi-pens can be kept with the student, but please inform Mills staff

Tour Behavior Highlights

- RULE
- Signed behavior contract required on file
- Trip is an extension of the classroom
- Alcohol & drugs are forbidden: Parent/guardian MUST retrieve student and bring them home. Costs associated with student retrieval will not be reimbursed. Offending student is suspended from school.
- No smoking or vaping anytime: Same as above
- District policy: Prescription & Non-prescription medications administered by Mills staff only, confidential, discreet; except epi-pen and inhalers (which stay with student)

Tour Behavior (Cont'd)

Highlights

- Students are not to ride any form of transportation other than Mills official transportation
- In the hotel, students are not allowed to enter any room except their own at any time
- Hotel rules and regulations must be strictly followed at all times
- At Great America, students must not leave the park without a chaperone for any reason
- Students must be with at least one other student at all times during the trip (think about G.A. rides)
- Weapons or items that could be considered a weapon are strictly prohibited

Students who have not turned in <u>both</u> the Medical Emergency Form <u>and</u> the Behavior Contract Form filled out and signed by a parent/guardian will not go on the trip (no refunds)

Room & Roommate Etiquette



- You will be sharing a room with up to five of your classmates. Most hotels will give you four fresh towels. Don't check in, take a shower and use three of them. If your five roommates have to share the last fresh towel, they will not be happy.
- Plan your shower schedule before you go to bed at night so you and your roommates aren't all expecting to take one at the same time (such as just before breakfast). Sometimes it helps if some of the roommates take their showers before they go to bed at night.

Room & Roommate Etiquette (Cont'd)

- Keep your stuff together, in your suitcase if possible. Your roommates will appreciate it and your things won't get misplaced.
- As a matter of common courtesy to the housekeeping staff, please put your trash, including food wrappers, in the wastebaskets when you leave your room.

Packing List





Student Packing List

You will be allowed one suitcase and one backpack All items must have a <u>name tag securely attached</u>



You must bring the following items:

- Musical instruments, hard case preferred
- Cell phone, charger, portable battery charger your cell phone must be on and well charged at ALL TIMES. If your phone dies, you must stay with someone with a working phone.
- Face masks (optional)
- Saturday lunch: Bring lunch (<u>must</u> eat before going to Great America) or bring payment to buy at Great America (credit card, debit card, or smartphone only; no cash)
- Clothes for 1+ day:
 - Concert attire for Saturday performance
 - Socks, undergarments
 - Bring layers, may be cold in the morning but warm in the afternoon, then cool again in the evening
 - Sweatshirt, light/warm jacket (packable down is a good option), light raincoat or poncho. Check the weather.
 - Sleeping attire (PJ's, sweatshirt/pants, etc)
 - Comfortable shoes, i.e. sneakers, walking for most of Saturday. Sandals can give blisters which can be painful.
 - Dress within the school dress code; Mills Handbook
 - Clothing with inappropriate logos or images will be confiscated.

Student Packing List (Cont'd)

Personal items include

- Medications: Labeled and given to Mills staff; epi-pen and inhalers kept with student, ask Mr. G; see handout for more details
- Toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, hairbrush, lotion, shampoo/conditioner, etc...)
- Deodorant
- Feminine hygiene items
- Sunscreen/Sunglasses/Hat
- Student ID/Driver's License
- Sleeping bag (optional), please write student's name in large print with Sharpie on a piece of masking tape
- Reusable water bottle (wide-mouth insulated type is best: easier to fill)
- Travel hand sanitizer
- Travel pack tissues

Student Packing List (Cont'd)

You <u>may</u> bring the following items: You are responsible if any of these items are lost or stolen

- Credit card/debit card/smartphone payment for souvenirs (Great America doesn't take cash) no alcohol/drug or related merchandise/paraphernalia
- Your homework/make-up work for school if needed, including supplies such as laptop computer (recommend securing it in in-room safe when left in hotel room unattended)
- Headsets/earbuds, if you plan to listen to your mobile devices; DO NOT FORGET THEM IN THE HOTEL ROOM WHEN WE DEPART. WE CANNOT GO BACK FOR THEM! Recommend bringing a cheap pair
- Camera

You <u>may not</u> bring the following items:

- Anything of value that you will miss if it disappears
- Expensive jewelry
- Excessive amounts of money
- Weapons, alcohol, any drugs legal and esp. illegal, or medication that is not preapproved with Mills staff

Student Packing List (Cont'd)

Meals

- Friday grab-and-go lunch provided by Mills cafeteria
- Friday dinner provided at the hotel
- Saturday breakfast provided at the hotel
- Saturday lunch, students bring (<u>must eat</u> before going to Great America) or buy at Great America <u>with own money</u>
- Return to Mills in time for late-ish dinner at home on Saturday

Backpacks are allowed at Great America (will be searched), and pay lockers are available. Be mindful if you carry around too many items or too large a pack, it will be inconvenient on rides as well as exhausting lugging it around all day. Fanny packs may be a good alternative to purses or bulging pockets.

Remember that music students are representatives of Mills High School, so look and act your best. Clothes should be well-fitting and clean, hair clean and neat.

Chaperones (Cont'd)

Illness & COVID Considerations

Per **SMUHSD & California Dept. of Public Health guidelines**, for Students and Chaperones:

- If you are experiencing severe symptoms of illness (sore throat, cough, fever, etc.) the day of the trip, you will need to stay home
- If you are experiencing mild illness, consider staying home or wearing a mask
- In either case, contact Mr. G immediately
- Therefore we <u>highly recommend being extra careful for 2</u> weeks prior to the trip (e.g. masking, social distancing, avoiding large indoor gatherings)

MMAG unfortunately cannot provide any refunds due to illness
